# Financial Secretary's Report: Hi Brothers:

Seeing that July is normally summer Vacation time here is a sometimes lighthearted look at what Jesus might have been doing in the Summer? Bro Mike

# So, what did Jesus do during the good ol' summertime? There is no mention in the Bible of His going on vacation, but we do know He was quite the outdoorsman.

So, what did Jesus do during the good ol' summertime? The Scriptures say almost nothing about His recreation or what He did over the summer. A case might be made for premotorized water-skiing since He could walk on water if He felt like it. However, what does the Bible say?

- **1**. Of course, He enjoyed the company of fisherman, which makes one wonder if He ever enjoyed flyfishing, angling or even spearfishing. Did He and the Twelve ever take the boat out just for fun? Go to the beach for a refreshing swim? The Bible just does not say.
- 2. Rock climbing? Given that the Lord was an outdoorsman, is it too much of a stretch to think that He enjoyed climbing to the summits before Him? Matthew 4:1 says after He was baptized in the Jordan River, He was "led up of the Spirit into the wilderness" for 40 days where He ate nothing for more than a month. Did He pray the entire time? Surely, He stretched His legs and enjoyed His Father's beautiful creation.
- **3. Public speaking.** If anything is certain from the biblical accounts, Jesus did a lot of personal appearances, Matthew 4:17 tells how Jesus loved to teach, preach and challenge God's people to change from their unproductive ways.
- **4. Cast fishing?** Matthew 4:18 tells how He was walking by the sea of Galilee and saw two brothers, Simon Peter, and Andrew, casting a net into the sea. However, instead of asking what was biting or dropping a hook Himself, he called out to them in Matthew 4:19, saying "Come with me, and I will make you fishers of men!" They not only abandoned their nets, but

almost immediately were joined by two other brothers, James, and John, who had been mending their nets with their dad, Zebedee. Everybody gave up fishing to follow Him. But did they ever fish just for fun? Or for a fresh seafood lunch? The Bible does not say.

- **5. Healing!** Matthew 4:23 says Jesus "went about in all Galilee," teaching, preaching and "healing all manner of disease and all manner of sickness among the people." Word spread as far as Syria and Jerusalem and Decapolis until large crowds were following Him "and they brought unto Him all that were sick with diverse diseases and torments, possessed with demons, epileptic and palsied" and He healed them.
- **6. Mountain climbing?** Matthew 5:1 tells how "seeing the multitudes, He went up into the mountain" where He apparently used the hillside as a natural amphitheater and delivered His historic Sermon on the Mount. Throughout the Gospels, He climbed to the mountaintops, enjoying God's beautiful world.
- **7. Boating.** Matthew 8 tells of a time when He was out on the Sea of Galilee and had dozed off when "a great tempest" rose in the sea, so much that the boat was covered with waves. Scared for their lives, His followers awoke Him, pleading for their lives. Calmly, He "rebuked the winds and the sea; and there was a great calm. And the men marveled, saying, What manner of man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey Him?"
- **8. Swimming?** Mathew 13 tells of His speaking to great crowds "by the seaside." At one point, He sat on a boat while "all the multitude stood on the beach." However, there is no mention whatsoever of anybody playing in the waves.
- **9. Storytelling.** While some of His sermons were blunt and to the point particularly as He chewed out hypocrites much of what He proclaimed to the great crowds were stories. In fact, in Matthew 13:10, the disciples asked him why He told parables. He explained that it was easier for the masses to listen to a story rather than a lecture.
- **10. Walking in the desert.** In Matthew 14, the Bible says He withdrew from the vast crowds in a boat and went "to a desert place apart." But the people "followed him on foot from the cities." It was enough to worry the Disciples who worried, "this place is desert, send the multitudes away, that they may go into the villages and buy themselves food." But Jesus instead performed a miracle, feeding several thousand people with five loaves and two fishes.
- **11. Meditation in quiet places.** In Matthew 14:22-23, He sent the Disciples away in a boat and "went up into the mountain apart to pray" and "He was there alone."
- **12. Walking on water.** In Matthew 14:24, He decided to join the Disciples who had left by boat and took a direct route straight across the water. Being Almighty God, walking on the Sea of Galilee even in the middle of yet another storm was no problem. The Disciples were amazed, and Peter even tried it himself. Matthew 14:30 tells how Peter "Saw the wind, he was afraid and beginning to sink, cried out, saying, Lord, save me." Immediately Jesus stretched out His hand, pulled him up and said "O ye of little faith." Matthew 14:33 tells how "they that were in the boat worshipped Him, saying, truly You are the Son of God."
- **13. Roughing it.** Matthew is pretty clear that Jesus and His followers didn't take any provisions with them. They lived off the land and probably camped out a lot. The elite of the day, the Pharisees and scribes, were offended, criticizing them in Matthew 15:2, demanding to know

why this rough bunch didn't even "wash their hands when they eat bread?" Jesus responded that clean hearts were far more important.

- **14. Fly fishing?** Did the Disciples only fish with nets? Not according to Matthew 17:24-27. It was time to pay taxes. However, nobody had any money. So, Jesus told His followers to go "to the sea and cast a hook and take up the fish that first comes up. When you have opened his mouth, you shall find a coin." So, odds are the Disciples did not have rods and reels, but perhaps they did a little fly fishing. At least they put a hook and line into the water and paid their taxes.
- **15. Hanging around with the kids!** In Matthew 19, the Disciples thought that Jesus should not be bothered with little kids. Jesus corrected them, gathered the kids around Him and let everybody know that the kids were more like the Kingdom of Heaven than the bickering adults.
- **16. Giving everything away.** When the rich came to talk with Him, He was less than impressed and advised them to give everything to the poor. "If you would be perfect, go, sell that which you have, and give to the poor, and you shall have treasure in heaven: and come, follow me." That didn't go over very well, particularly with one young man who "went away sorrowful; for he was one that had great possessions."

Throughout the Gospel accounts of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, there is no indication that Jesus shunned sports. Nor is there any account of him attending a chariot race or challenging Thomas to arm wrestle. Did He play kickball with the teens? Splash in the surf with families? Jog early mornings with Peter and Andrew? Perhaps! After all, the Gospel of John 21:25 tells us "And there are also many other things which Jesus did. If they should be all recorded one by one in detail, I suppose that even the world itself could not have room for the books that would be written." *So, who knows?*





Summer is in full swing; vacations and backyard barbeques, outdoor sports and yard-work! I look forward to this time of year with flowers in bloom and thoughts of a much needed and anticipated summer vacation. I hope your summer is going well for you!

In last month's message I mentioned taking stock of all the things that need to be done around the house. And I further suggested that taking stock should extend to seeing where you and your family stand when it comes to financial protection. It's interesting to read about Blessed Michael McGivney's attitude in *Faith and Fraternalism* by Christopher J. Kauffman: "Though he [Fr. McGivney] seems to have been well aware of the value of ceremonials as the binding force for fraternal unity, he spent his energy in promoting the insurance feature." You know the story well; how the untimely death of his father nearly derailed Fr. McGivney's plans to become a priest. As the curate of St. Mary's, he encountered families in similar situations. So

it's no wonder he was so practical when it came to making sure families were financially sound.

In my position I feel a deep kinship with Fr. McGivney in helping to protect Catholic families. I see myself as your partner in facing this planning process. You don't have to go it alone. With our new financial needs analysis tool, with cutting edge software, robust and in-depth, we can approach this together. Since my last message, a number of members reached out to me. Let me give you a fictionalized account about two of them.

I recently met with a brother Knight and his wife who have a couple of young children. Together, we were able to see that based on what this couple wanted for their family, there was a need in two particular areas. One, the brother's group life insurance, while free as a benefit, was not enough to do what he wanted his life insurance to do. He desired more to make sure, if he had an untimely passing, his wife and children could stay in the same home, could afford to make University Education a reality. The other area that he had not thought about was what I call the "death of his earning power." What if he became sick or hurt and could not work? His employer provided very minimal coverage for a few months, but after that there was nothing. We explored how the Knights could fill that void and make his family whole. All this from spending time with me. The best part for him...and for you, is that this service is absolutely free. Many others in the industry charge fees for this kind of analysis. It's a fraternal benefit that I am happy to provide.

The other couple was recently retired. Well past the stage of this former young couple. I completed a financial needs analysis for them. They were in very good shape financially; had all their proverbial ducks in a row in almost every area. The area that they were concerned with was an extended care event. How could they protect all that they had worked for and saved in the event of needing help with daily living activities? I was able to help them plan for that and shift the financial burden to the Knights. The other issue they looked at was setting aside a little of what they had saved to help their grandchildren. We were able to set up a plan to pass that money tax free to them.

Maybe you have similar concerns; meeting with me can allay them. I am your partner as we share our brotherhood in the Order. That kind of relationship is rarely found elsewhere in the financial services world. Let's get together and see where you stand.
