



Hi Brothers:

Who Was Saint Patrick and Should Christians Celebrate St. Patrick's Day?

When it comes to Saint Patrick, the true story is even more exciting than the legend and the myth. The facts are far better than the fable. This day that belongs to St. Patrick has become about leprechauns, shamrocks, pots of gold, and green—green everywhere. Famously, the City of Chicago dumps forty pounds of its top-secret dye into the river. A green racing stripe courses through the city. But long before there was the St. Patrick of myth, there was the Patrick of history. Who was Patrick?

Patrick was born in 385 in Roman Britannia in the modern-day town of Dumbarton, Scotland. Patrick opens his autobiographical *St. Patrick's Confession* with these opening lines:

My name is Patrick. I am a sinner, a simple country person, and the least of all believers. I am looked down upon by many. My father was Calpornius. He was a deacon; his father was Potitus, a priest, who lived at Bannavem Taburniae. His home was near there, and that is where I was taken prisoner. I was about sixteen at the time.

Patrick skips over much of his first sixteen years. But who can blame him? At sixteen and being captured by barbarian Irish pirates is a pretty exciting place to begin a story. When the pirates landed on the Irish coast, they took Patrick about 200 miles inland where he was a shepherd and farm laborer. Six years passed and Patrick had either a vivid dream or a vision in which he was shown an escape route. Emboldened, Patrick made his break from his captors, traveling back over the 200 miles to the shoreline. As he approached the docks, a British ship stood waiting. The sails unfurled and Patrick was home. But he didn't stay long.

Before he was a prisoner, Patrick's Christian faith meant little to him. That changed during his captivity. His previously ambivalent faith galvanized and served to buoy him through those long, dark days. Now that he was back in his homeland he committed to his faith in earnest. He became a priest and soon felt a tremendous burden for the people that had kidnapped him. So he returned to Ireland with a mission.

Patrick had no less of a goal than seeing pagan Ireland converted. These efforts did not set well with Loegaire (or Leoghaire), the pagan king of pagan Ireland. Patrick faced danger and even threats on his life. He took to carrying a dagger. Yet, despite these setbacks, Patrick persisted. Eventually the king converted and was baptized by Patrick and much of the people of Ireland followed suit. A later legend would have it that Patrick rid all of Ireland of snakes. Snakes were not native to Ireland at the time. Instead, Patrick rid Ireland of marauding ways and a cultural and civil barbarianism by bringing not only Christianity to Ireland, but by

bringing a whole new ethic. It was not too long ago that a New York Times' bestselling book argued that St. Patrick and his Ireland saved civilization.

Patrick would come to be known as the "Apostle of Ireland." He planted churches, the first one likely at a place called Saul, in Northern Ireland, a bit inland from the coast and just below Belfast. Patrick planted more churches as he crisscrossed Ireland. The challenge with Patrick is sifting through the legend. Take the shamrock for instance. Some biographers claim definitively that Patrick used the shamrock as an object lesson to teach pagans about the Trinity, that God is one in essence and three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. There is no evidence, however, for such a claim.

Curiously, like most of his legend, St. Patrick is not even truly a saint. He has never been canonized by the Roman Catholic Church. Patrick himself told us he was a sinner, not a saint.

Legend further has it that Patrick died on March 17, 461. He likely died in Saul, where he planted his first church. A significant monument stands atop the hill overlooking the town. Panels depicting scenes from Patrick's life surround the monument's base.

So we remember Patrick best not in the legends and fables and not in the ways his holiday tends to be celebrated. Perhaps we remember him best by reflecting on the "St. Patrick's Breastplate," which has traditionally been attributed to him. The word breastplate is a translation of the Latin word *lorica*, a prayer, especially for protection. These prayers would be written out and at times placed on shields of soldiers and knights as they went out to battle. St. Patrick's *Lorica* points beyond himself and his adventurous life. It points to Christ, the one he proclaimed to the people who had taken him captive:

Christ with me,
Christ before me,
Christ behind me,
Christ in me,
Christ beneath me,
Christ above me,
Christ on my right,
Christ on my left,
Christ when I lie down,
Christ when I sit down,
Christ when I arise,
Christ in the heart of every man who thinks of me,
Christ in the mouth of everyone who speaks of me,
Christ in every eye that sees me,
Christ in every ear that hears me.

And on the lighter side

- Mr. Murphy goes to the doctor.

"Oh, the tablets were fine," says Mrs. Murphy, "It was all the skipping that killed him!"

Chancellor's Report

I hope you and your families are all well and keeping safe.

Finally, we have some wonderful news that we have been waiting for, from His Eminence Thomas Cardinal Collins, Archbishop of Toronto, dated March 12, 2021.

Earlier today, the provincial government announced changes to the restrictions on places of worship currently in the Grey (Lockdown) Zone. As of Monday, March 15, 2021, churches in this designation (in the archdiocese, currently Toronto and Peel Regions) will be permitted 15 per cent capacity for religious services.

This is a significant improvement from the hard cap of 10 people that has been in place for several months and it is a more balanced approach in light of the recently relaxed restrictions in other sectors.

On December 8, 2020 Pope Francis had dedicated the year ahead to St. Joseph, the man whom God the Father chose as the spouse of the Virgin Mary, and guardian of his incarnate son. We often overlook St. Joseph and the example he set for us –as a man of faith and integrity; as a model of fatherhood and family life; and as guardian of the household at Nazareth and of the Church. Pope Pious IX declared St. Joseph the Patron of the Universal Church 150 years ago.

Just as St. Joseph watched over the household in Nazareth, so too he watches over the Church universal. At a time when the church is beset by divisions and scandals, and people are falling away from the faith, we need St. Joseph's prayers more than ever. As Knights, let us ask his prayers so that we may continue to be a source of strength and unity for the Church, now and in the years ahead.

St. Joseph is the Patron St. of Canada.

to the family of God.


Sustain us in our emotional commitments, where



ELECTIONS 2021 / 2022

Brothers,

Once again it is time to select officers for the upcoming Fraternal Year. These officers serve a one (1) year term, excluding the Trustee Three Year, who will, of course serve Three (3) years. Please consider if you would like to stand for office. If you would like to stand, have a Brother Knight nominate you and have a "second" second your nomination. Any 3rd degree Brother in good standing is eligible to run for office.

Remember, if elected, you are expected to attend all Officers' Meetings as well as all Council Meetings.



Below you will find a list of positions and responsibilities for those positions.

GRAND KNIGHT

The Grand Knight presides over all Council Meetings. It is his obligation to ensure that all the rules and regulations of both our Council and Order are adhered to. He is also

the chairman of the financial Committee that may be formed within the Council. He must also perform such other duties as the Order requires.

DEPUTY GRAND KNIGHT

Should the Grand Knight be unable to carry out his duties, the Deputy Grand Knight should be ready to step in and take over the Grand Knight's duties. He shall work closely with the Membership Director in the recruitment of new members.

CHANCELLOR

The Chancellor is the liaison between the Council Executive and the Columbian Squires. He also has a part to play in some of the squire Ceremonials. He shall also assist the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight in the performance of their duties and shall take charge of the Council during the incapacity or extended absence of both. He shall encourage the Membership in the activities of the Council.

TREASURER

The Treasurer works very closely with the Financial Secretary and the Trustees in his duties of depositing monies received from the Financial Secretary and issuing cheques by a warrant; authorization given him by the Financial Secretary. Accurate records of all incomes and expenditures must be available at the request of the Trustees for Council audits, which takes place twice a year.

RECORDER

The Recorder is responsible for the taking of minutes of all General and Executive Meetings. In addition, he must maintain a record of all the Council's correspondence.

ADVOCATE

The Advocate is the Council's lawyer in a trial and investigation of any matter of interest to the Council. He should be thoroughly familiar with all the Laws of the Order as stated in the "Charter, Constitution and Laws".

WARDEN

The Warden has charge of all Council's properties except money, account and record books. He instructs the Council Guards on their duties and is responsible for the preparation of the Council Chambers for meetings.

TRUSTEE (THREE YEAR)

One trustee is elected each year for a term of three (3) years. The Trustees form the major part of the finance Committee, which also includes the Grand Knight, the Financial Secretary and the Treasurer. This Committee also audits the Council books and files an audit report with the Council, State Board and the Supreme Council.

GUARDS (4 to be elected)

The (2) Inside and (2) Outside Guards, at the discretion of the Warden, carry out their duties of attending to the setup of the Council Chambers and the admission of Members of the same.

Nominations will be opened at the April General Meeting and will be reopened at the May General Meeting. Voting for the new Executive will take place after nominations are closed at the May General Meeting.



